- Collaborate with coalition partners to advance legislative initiatives in support of policy and funding priorities.
- Communicate and publicize the diverse activities and successes by Community Action for increased community understanding and engagement.

The Community Action Network, established in 1964, connects national and local organizations to assist low to moderate-income individuals, aiming to build resilience and self-sufficiency by overcoming systemic barriers to alleviate poverty. In Minnesota, 24 Community Action Agencies and 11 Tribal Nations cover all 87 counties, offering a range of services such as housing aid,
